Jurnal dialog dipilih sebagai aktifitas komunikatif sebagai wadah interaksi antara 13 siswa bahasa Inggris sebagai bahasa asing (EFL) dan seorang pengajar sekaligus peneliti. Melalui jurnal tersebut, siswa diminta menulis kegiatan lampau mereka dan tulisan tersebut dikomentari oleh pengajar. Dalam komentarnya, pengajar memberikan pengubahan pada bentuk kata kerja lampau tidak berterima siswa. Terdapat tujuh entri jurnal selama perlakuan diberikan. Tiga jurnal entri pertama menerima pengubahan tanpa penguatan, sisanya menerima pengubahan dengan penguatan. Setiap entri jurnal diukur tingkat konsistensinya untuk melihat perkembangan konsistensi siswa. Terdapat pre- dan post test yang juga diukur akurasinya untuk melihat dampak perlakuan pada siswa. Hasil penelitian menunjukkan bahwa pengubahan, terutama apabila diberi penguatan, memengaruhi konsistensi siswa terhadap penggunaan kata kerja berketerangan waktu lampau. Pengubahan juga memicu siswa untuk memodifikasi keluaran (output) mereka ke dalam bentuk yang lebih berterima dalam bahasa target.
