Abstrak

[Skripsi ini menelaah kasus industri persinemaan Belanda untuk mengetahui apabila eksek kapasitas berhubungan dengan perilaku ancaman masuk. Eksplorasi ini dilakukan dengan replikasi parsial pendekatan empirikal mengenai bagaimana pangsa pasar mempengaruhi eksek kapasitas. Permasalahan utama yang hendak dijawab melalui skripsi ini adalah: seberapa terkonsentrasinya pasar industri persinemaan di Belanda dan bagaimana keadaan tersebut berhubungan dengan eksek kapasitas.
