

Kajian CPTED Generasi Kedua untuk Penguatan Program Asimilasi WBP di Kebayoran Lama dan Kebayoran Baru = Study of Second Generation CPTED for Strengthening the Assimilation Program of Inmates in Kebayoran Lama and Kebayoran Baru

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Abstrak

Penelitian ini mengkaji penerapan teori Second Generation Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) dalam memperkuat proses asimilasi Warga Binaan Pemasyarakatan (WBP) dengan masyarakat di wilayah Kebayoran Lama dan Kebayoran Baru. Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk mengatasi tantangan asimilasi, seperti stigma negatif dan keterbatasan penerimaan masyarakat, serta mengeksplorasi peran pendekatan berbasis komunitas. Dengan menggunakan metode campuran, penelitian ini mengintegrasikan survei kuantitatif dan wawancara kualitatif dengan WBP, masyarakat, dan pembimbing kemasyarakatan. Hasil penelitian menunjukkan bahwa kohesi sosial, budaya komunitas, konektivitas, dan kapasitas ambang merupakan faktor kunci keberhasilan asimilasi. Selain itu, intervensi berbasis CPTED Gen 2, seperti peningkatan fasilitas publik dan edukasi masyarakat, menunjukkan hasil yang menjanjikan dalam mengurangi stigma dan mendukung reintegrasi. Kesimpulannya, implementasi CPTED Gen 2 mendukung program asimilasi yang berkelanjutan dan menekankan pentingnya kolaborasi aktif antara masyarakat dan sistem peradilan pidana.

.....This study examines the application of the Second Generation Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) theory in strengthening the assimilation process of incarcerated individuals (WBP) with the community in Kebayoran Lama and Kebayoran Baru. This research aims to address assimilation challenges, such as negative stigma and limited public acceptance, and to explore the role of community-based approaches. Employing a mixed-method approach, the study integrates quantitative surveys and qualitative interviews with WBP, community members, and probation officers. The findings highlight that social cohesion, community culture, connectivity, and threshold capacity are key factors in successful assimilation. Furthermore, CPTED Gen 2-based interventions, such as enhanced public facilities and community education, show promising results in reducing stigma and promoting reintegration. In conclusion, the implementation of CPTED Gen 2 supports sustainable assimilation programs and emphasizes the need for active collaboration between communities and the criminal justice system.
